Admission Requirements

1. Gain acceptance into the University of Central Florida.
 2. Completion of AA (Associate of Arts Degree) from a Florida Community College or UCF General Education Program including the Gordon Rule
 3. Complete a declaration of major indicating Social Work as the major field of study.
 4. Obtain a minimum of "C" (2.5) Grade Point Average or better on 4.0 scale.
 5. Completion of the School of Social Work Application
 6. Completion or exemption of the CLAST – The College Level Academic Skills Test
 7. Completion of the BSW Program pre requisites must be completed prior to starting the program. These include:
 - Biology
 - Psychology
 - Sociology
 - American National Government
 - Economics
- Admissions are accepted during the summer or fall semesters only.
